The Paleopathology Association (PPA) is an international scientific association that promotes the study of paleopathology all over the world. The Scientific Meetings of the PPA are events that have been traditionally held annually or biannually in North America and Europe for more than 35 years, bringing together academics from diverse branches of medicine and anthropology. Similarly, in recent years the successful South American Meetings in Rio de Janeiro (2005) and Santiago de Chile (2007) allowed Latin American students and professionals to present their research and make contact with colleagues from other countries and continents.

The spirit of this 3rd Meeting can be summed up under the title “Bridges and Transitions”. This can be understood in lots of different ways: the different ways of understanding the relationship between nature and culture, between man and the environment in which he lives, in the bridges that run between the different lines of theories, interests and the many questions of researchers across the world, and also the diverse issues that surround the societies they study.
